



Pastel Landscapes Inside & Out with *Laura Frykman* Supply List

Pastels for Beginners: A basic selection of chalk pastels; there is usually a started set of 18-24 colors that is reasonable in cost, by Schminke, Sennelier, or Richeson. If you can get ½ stick sets, which offer more color choices for your money.

Soft Pastel Brands: Winsor-Newton, Unison, Richeson, Sennelier, or Schmincke are preferred

Intermediate students or serious beginners: Buy a few harder ones (Rembrandts or Yarkas for edges; for eg. Dark brown, black, white, or cream).

If you buy individual colors- for every color you buy, get a light, medium, and very dark version of it. For eg., peach, orange/tangerine, and dark burnt orange, or red/orange.

For landscapes, be sure to get a range of yellow-greens, and darkest blue.

Other Supplies:

Drawing board or Masonite, available at EAC store

Beige Masking Tape (no colored tape)

Sandpaper choices:

-Art Spectrum Colourfix sandpaper –you can buy individual sheets from me.

-Wallis- Belgian mist or white, professional grade

-Pastelboards- stiff boards with sandpaper-like surface. Can be washed off and re-used

-Sennelier sandpaper- called “ LaCarte pastel cards”

-Hahnemuhle velour paper-like painting on velvet

-I can show you how to prepare you own pastel surface with pumice

Canson Mi Tiente drawing paper or any paper with texture

The image won't look as deep and fewer layers are possible. It will look more like a drawing, not a painting

Photos:

Bring a few photos that you like, with a range of difficulties, to pick from.

Don't forget: Your own photos are best, since your inspiration is “built in” already!

When you are done, you'll have a true original to show off!
