Subject: Consideration Of Ordinance No. 2012-11 CSO Parking Attendant Amendment Including Waiver of Second Reading	

ACTION REQUESTED:

Adopt Ordinance No. 2012-11.

INFORMATION/BACKGROUND:

Edina City Ordinance 1400.17 subd. (1) defines whom the “enforcing officers” are for the “regulations and requirements” of this section.

This section of the ordinance currently states that “The Police Chief and all police officers of the City shall be responsible for enforcing all the regulations and requirements of this section”.

In order to clarify that some specific parking enforcement duties have been delegated to our Community Service Officers, Animal Control Officers and Parking Monitors, we have amended this subsection. This subsection will now include those titles as also having authority to enforce subsection 1400.10, which is titled “Parking, Stopping and Standing; Loading”.

Section 1400.17 subd. (1) will now read: The Police Chief and all police officers of the City shall be responsible for enforcing all the regulations and requirements of this section. In addition, Community Service Officers, Parking Monitors, and Animal Control Officers of the City shall be responsible for enforcing subsection 1400.10.

City Attorney Roger Knutson has reviewed and approved the language change.

ORDINANCE NO. 2012-11
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE EDINA CITY CODE
CONCERNING CONTROL OF TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

The City Council Of Edina Ordains:

Section 1. Subsection 1400.17 of the Edina City Code is amended to read:

1400.17 Enforcement.

Subd. 1 **Enforcing Officers.** The Police Chief and all police officers of the City shall be responsible for enforcing all the regulations and requirements of this Section. In addition, Community Service Officers, Parking Monitors, and Animal Control Officers of the City shall be responsible for enforcing Subsection 1400.10.

Subd. 2 **Failure to Give Name and Address.** Any person who, when arrested for a violation of this Section, willfully refuses to give such person's name or address, or who gives a false name or address, shall be guilty of a violation of this Section, regardless of the offense with which the person was originally charged.

Subd. 3 **Parking Violations.** Whenever a parked motor vehicle is found without an operator and in violation of any parking restrictions of this Section, the Enforcing Officer shall enter on the traffic ticket the date and time, the license number of the vehicle and data as to the nature of the violation, and shall affix the ticket conspicuously to the vehicle.

Subd. 4 No unauthorized person shall regulate or attempt to regulate traffic upon the streets and highways of the City. The Police Chief may approve individuals to direct traffic at specified location and times subject to such training as the Police Chief determines is necessary.

Section 2. This ordinance is effective immediately upon its passage and publication.
