

BRAEMAR FIELD: ENCOMPASSING EDINA'S SPORTS NEEDS

Edina's newest facility, Braemar Field, will bring people together and provide new athletic opportunities for the community. It was in that spirit of collaboration that the project was born.

The Edina Soccer Club, Edina Football Association, Edina Baseball Association and Edina Lacrosse Association were all instrumental in bringing Braemar Field, a covered sports dome in the winter and open field in the summer, to life.

For many years, the athletic associations and City have worked together to solve issues the athletic associations sometimes face. For the past five years, most of those conversations have been about limited field space.

"It was the City that initiated the conversation," said Mick Spence of the

Edina Football Association. "It was really neat to have the City Council, Mayor, City staff and consultants all working together with us to help make this a reality."

Each association had been pursuing field and facility expansion for a number of years. According to Lyn Gustafson of the Edina Lacrosse Association, Braemar Field ended up being a collaboration between the associations and the City.

"There was a great combination of athletic associations that worked great together," said Jeff May of the Edina Baseball Association. "The ability to bring most of the athletic associations together and work out a proposal to work [toward meeting each group's] needs was critical to the project."

Not only will this new development be more convenient for parents and

players, it will also provide the City with another elite facility. The new 400-foot-long, 250-foot-wide and 250-foot-high dome is built for more than just one sport's footprint, making it one of the biggest dome structures in the state. Braemar Field also boasts a track that will be available to the public when team practices aren't taking place.

"Braemar Field is another added benefit to living in Edina," said Gustafson. "It makes Edina the premiere community to be. We have everything [from a golf course to a sports dome] and our location is so centrally located that it is going to bring other communities into Edina."

Each association will have priority to use the new facility during their primary season, but will use the space year-round for training, clinics and other special events.

"I really think this is going to make all of [us] stronger in the future and trade and share space," said Gustafson.

"It took an incredibly dedicated group of volunteers from athletic associations and the Park Board to work with City staff to figure out a plan on a location [for a dome] that would work well for all of our athletic associations," noted Parks & Recreation Director Ann Kattreh. "Once we determined that the current location was the best and the most feasible, the athletic associations really put their heads together to determine how we could best utilize the fields and the dome."

"Edina is now back to representing something that's very important for residents: excellence," said Jeff Northrop of the Edina Soccer Club. "Residents should be really proud of this because it's a world-class venue and we are providing excellent offerings [to them]."

In conjunction with the project at Braemar, Pamela Park is also getting a facelift. Because Braemar Field was built on what had been soccer fields, the City is developing additional field space at Pamela.

A grand opening celebration will be held at Braemar Field Friday, Dec. 5, beginning at 6:30 p.m. The dome will be inflated from November until the end of April and will be open-air artificial turf the rest of the year.

CANCELLATION/REFUND POLICY

All refund requests will be assessed a \$5 administrative fee. Full refunds are given only when a program or reservation is canceled by the Parks & Recreation Department. No refunds will be given for cancellations requested less than five business days prior to the start of a program or reservation. Under the discretion of the Parks & Recreation Director, partial credit will be considered if cancellation is due to injury or serious illness.

CONFIRMATION

Program confirmation is usually sent one week before your class begins. If the program is full, you are given the option of being placed on a waiting list.

FINANCIAL AID

Several civic organizations have contributed to the Van Valkenburg Fund for Children through the Edina Community Foundation, which supports the Grant-In-Aid Program. BICYCLE & WALKING PATHS

The City of Edina offers several scenic paths for bicycling, walking, jogging, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing. To ensure the safety and enjoyment of everyone, motorized vehicles are prohibited on the paths.

THE BREDESEN PARK BIKE PATH

The Bredesen Park bike path is two miles long and located south of Vernon Avenue and east of Gleason Road. Also available is a separate two-mile walking path. These paths encircle Bredesen Park, which has been developed as a nature study area. Access to the paths is on Vernon Avenue or Olinger Boulevard.

THE LAKE CORNELIA PATH

The 1.1-mile Lake Cornelia path encircles the northern portion of Lake Cornelia, south of the Crosstown Highway and west of the Edina Aquatic Center. Access is on 66th Street or West Shore Drive.
