AIR CONDITIONING, INDOORS TO BE OUT OF STYLE THIS SUMMER

As the saying goes, a little dirt never hurt anyone. Neither do grass stains, sandy hair or a farmer's tan. So abandon that air conditioner, box up the video games and get the children outdoors this summer!

Since the 1960s, the Edina Parks & Recreation Department has hosted a variety of six-week Playground Programs, which offer supervised and structured outdoor activities that focus on fun, physical fitness and socialization. A

variety of themed activities, which include a weekly visit from a craft specialist, are provided with the goal of keeping children physically active and creative.

"One of the most important things that these programs offer is the chance for kids to be around nature," said Recreation Supervisor Donna Tilsner. "The experience teaches teamwork, rules and sharing, and the playground leaders really have an opportunity to lead by example to impart quality values on the kids." The programs also include an educational piece or fun science project.

The program has evolved through the years according to popularity and trends in learning, but the City Council has always been supportive of the Playground Program as a core service provided by the City. In 2012, more than 700 children participated in the program. In addition, 40 high school- or college-age Playground Leaders, ages 16 years and older, were also involved to ensure that participants of all ages and abilities had a good experience.

"My 10-year-old son who didn't want to sign up for the program – he'd never done it before – had an absolute blast," said a parent whose child played one year at Lewis Park. "He was excited to

go every time. His favorite was 'world cup soccer.' It was also nice to see him have the opportunity to interact with the younger kids at the program."

Children ages 6 to 10 who have completed kindergarten can register for "Playgrounds." The Playground Program takes place at six of Edina's parks and includes Monday and Wednesday sessions and Tuesday and Thursday sessions.

"Fab 4 & 5" and "Super 6 & 7" are nearly identical to the Playground Program, but focus on games and activities that are more appropriate for 4 and 5 year olds or 6 and 7 year olds. The staff concentrates on helping children stay engaged and foster new friendships.

For the children who are too young to be Playground Leaders but too old to participate, a newer program called "Leaders in Training" is offered for ages 13 through 15 to teach leadership skills and provide a mentorship service for learning productive ways to communicate with children and parents in the programs.

The newest addition to the Playground Programs is an "Edible Playground" at Lewis Park. "The goal is to introduce children, ages 7 through 11, to gardening," Recreation Supervisor Kristin Aarsvold

said. "It will also help by making the connection to the food we eat fueling young bodies for recreation." Pizza and salsa plots will be planted as a way to illustrate the connection between the garden and the table, and a "harvest dinner" will be held for participants, families and volunteers in late August.



BICYCLE & WALKING PATHS

The City of Edina offers several scenic paths for bicycling, walking, jogging, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing. To ensure the safety and enjoyment of everyone, motorized vehicles are prohibited on the paths.

THE BREDESEN PARK BIKE PATH

The Bredesen Park bike path is two miles long and located south of Vernon Avenue and east of Gleason Road. Also available is a separate two-mile walking path. These paths encircle Bredesen Park, which has been developed as a nature study area. Access to the paths is on Vernon Avenue or Olinger Boulevard.

THE LAKE CORNELIA PATH

The 1.1-mile Lake Cornelia path encircles the northern portion of Lake Cornelia, south of the Crosstown Highway and west of the Edina Aquatic Center. Access is on 66th Street or West Shore Drive.

ADOPT-A-PARK

The City of Edina encourages individuals or groups to participate in the Adopt-A-Park program. Participants make a two-year commitment during which they pick up litter at their adopted park at least twice a year. They also notify the City of any safety hazards in the park.
