## **VIKING HILLS NEIGHBORHOOD RECONSTRUCTION**

Dear Residents:

### **Vernon Hills Road, Vernon Court and Gleason Court**

Crews will continue restoring damaged landscaping, irrigation systems, pet fences, etc. They will also replace disturbed boulevard areas with black dirt. As the entire project moves forward, these areas will eventually be restored with sod.

### **Arctic Way, Polar Circle, and Glacier Place**

Crews have completed installing and connecting sump drain mainlines, cleanouts and service stubs on Arctic Way and Polar Circle.

Next week crews will focus on completing the installation of sump pump mainlines, cleanouts and service stubs on Glacier Place.

On **Friday, July 6**, crews will work to grind up the existing roadway on Arctic Way, Polar Circle, and Glacier Place. This grinding process will be a moving operation (crews will be shaping and compacting the material in place as the machine moves along). The roadway is open to traffic during this work, but minor delays can be expected while the work is taking place.

During the week of July 9, crews will begin shaping and grading the streets. They will start grading Arctic Way, move to Polar Circle and eventually on to Glacier Place. Again, this is a moving operation and the roadway will be open to traffic as the contractor grades the streets in preparation for the new pavement.

Crews will soon install temporary **"No Parking This Side of Street"** signs on one side of the roadway while it is being graded. This will allow emergency vehicles, service vehicles, trucks and local traffic to drive thru the neighborhood.

Crews hope to have the first layer of pavement in place within the next 2-3 weeks.

### **Irrigation and Pet Containment**

If your system is damaged from construction, the contractor has a kit to temporarily repair the system so the rest of your irrigation will work. These systems will be permanently repaired prior to site restoration.

### **Safety**

Please remind your children to stay away from construction sites, construction machinery, and stockpiled materials. These sites, machines, and materials can be dangerous. Job site safety is our number one concern.
