4-MAN HOCKEY LEAGUE RULES

Rosters are due before your first game. You can add players up to January 17, 2012.

1. Games will consist of two, 20-minute halves running time with a five minute half-time. Switch goals for second half. If game ends tied, play one five minute overtime. If score is tied after overtime, it will be recorded as a tie game.
2. Teams must have three players to start a game. If they are short they will be penalized one point for each five minutes until they have three. If a team is still short 20 minutes after scheduled game time, it is a forfeit.
3. **Team captains are responsible to keep track of the score** (one point each time the puck enters any of the four openings on the goalie board). **Winning team captain must report the score to the time keeper.**
4. **No body checking, spearing, hooking, tripping, fighting or otherwise rough play is permitted at any time. Anyone fighting will automatically be suspended for the season.**
5. The center red line is the off-side line. No player can precede the puck across the red line into his offensive zone.
6. If a team plays the puck from behind their red line and the puck goes all the way to the goal or the goal line, untouched, it will be icing.
7. Following any goal, all four players on the team which has scored must return to their side of the red line until the other team has either passed or skated the puck into play.
8. No slap-shots allowed. Sticks should not go above waist level on either the back-swing or follow through.
9. **No player is allowed to stand in the crease in front of either goal unless the puck is already in the crease.**
10. No drinking in the parks, parking lots or surrounding streets.
11. Each team is expected to supply at least four pucks. This will help to keep play moving when someone scores or the puck leaves the rink.
12. When the puck is shot out of the rink, the other team gets a free pass-in from the point along the side boards at which the puck was shot. On a free pass-in, the player passing the puck must be next to the side boards and all other players must stay at least 10 feet from him. If the puck goes out off two players simultaneously, the team in their defensive zone will get the pass-in.
13. Any goal immediately following a rule infraction (slap shot, etc.) by the scoring team will be disallowed.
14. Any time a player throws his stick at the puck, the other team will automatically be awarded one point.
15. **The two team captains will control the game and enforce the rules.** On rule infractions, the offended team gets a free pass-in along the sideboards closest to the point of the infraction.
